

Transfer Station Information

Traffic is one way around the station for safety reasons; please do not back-up if you miss an area you should go around again.

Only household trash is to be disposed of in the hopper, no recyclables, metal or other non-trash items should be disposed of here. Every ton we can remove from trash will save the town \$85 in tipping fees.

Caps must be removed from the plastic that is recycled: this allows more compaction, which results in heavier bales.

All corrugated cardboard is recycled.

Other cardboard needs to be placed in with the paper, i.e. cereal boxes, soda boxes, etc.

There are separate bins for glass, aluminum cans and tin cans (which is where the paint pails will go).

If you have construction debris such as: wood, sheetrock or pressure treated wood you must see an attendant as these carry a disposal fee.

Used oil filters and oil are accepted (oil should be in clear containers under five gallons in size) place on table so marked.

For all metal please check out the information also on this site, there are many changes here due to our vendor.

Any item, which has Freon in it, has a fee attached to it; doors must be removed from refrigerators before disposal.

Items left without payment may be considered as littering which carries a fine of up to \$250.

The brush pile is for brush only, no lumber may be put here. Due to State law no wood larger than 5" in diameter is to be left in the brush pile. Please see attendant for all brush disposal.

The compost pile is for yard waste only, please do not bring any food or pet waste. This pile is for leaves and grass clippings ONLY. Only biodegradable yard bags are allowed all others must be removed. Once the yard waste is composted and turned into loam, the Residents are welcome to use for their personal uses.
